CCA Bursary Scheme – Terms and Conditions

Applications

All applicants must be a current CCA 'Full Member' and an elected Conservative councillor. Welsh councillors who are current members of the CCA can also apply for the scheme.

The CCA reserve the right to withdraw the bursary should the applicant resign or be suspended as a Conservative councillor.

If you provide the CCA with incorrect or incomplete information, or if you fail to complete the responsibilities that are expected from you, we have the right to terminate our agreement with you and remove you from the scheme.

The Scheme

The Scheme is open to CCA Full Members and priority will be given to applicants who are part of an under-represented group (young female councillors (under the age of 35), councillors with disabilities, councillors in small Council Groups or councillors from an ethnic minority).

The CCA reserve the right to cancel and amend the scheme at any point.

Travel costs for bursary holders attending CCA events will not be reimbursed.

There is no cash alternative offered.

Free passes to CCA events will be given subject to availability.

By submitting an application for a bursary, you agree to disclose your personal information and for this to be held by the CCA and the Conservative Party. You also agree to feature in CCA publications and advertisements. Your personal information will be used for legitimate purposes in connection with the bursary.

Process

Successful applicants will be selected by the CCA Board and we will only contact successful applicants. Applications will be assessed by the application form.

Bursaries will only be allocated after the full bursary application has been submitted and applications will be assessed after the deadline.
